GLOSSARY

Cursillo – A short course of Christian living, reflecting the Spanish origins of the movement

Cursillista – Someone who has been on a Cursillo weekend

Ultreya – A Spanish word of encouragement, used also as the name for periodical area meetings for encouragement, worship and learning

Reunion Group – The heartbeat of Cursillo: regular local meetings of a small number of Cursillistas in which they share their life of piety, study and action

Cursillo encourages individuals to engage with their spirituality and to develop a rule of life based on piety, study and action

"When I went on my Cursillo weekend I already believed that Jesus had died for me and was resurrected, and that God loved me; but I couldn't really grasp that I was forgiven everything... at the weekend I learned that I really could be forgiven and make a fresh start, whatever I had done" (A, Berks)

Cursillo seeks to make disciples. More than that: Cursillo seeks to turn disciples into apostles

Cursillo encourages individuals to identify environments in which they may make a difference, whether homes, workplace or their church congregations
