

Spiritual Directors Report

Despite the disappointment of having no weekends in 2017, I believe Cursillo still has plenty to offer to enable mission and ministry within our large diocese.

Pauline and I had a good meeting with Bishop Steven in March, to welcome him on behalf of Cursillo and to seek his endorsement for us to continue to operate in the diocese, which of course he was happy to give! Indeed, we were able to draw strong parallels with the Cursillo method of Piety/Prayer, Study (of environments) and Action for Christ with his new diocesan strategy based upon the 3 'C's of Contemplation, Compassion, and Courage. The ultimate aim of both is that we become more Christlike, both as individuals and as

a church, as we root ourselves in God's love, grace and mercy, study the needs of the world around us with the "mind of Christ", and then respond courageously in the power of the Spirit. We agreed in principle to hold a Clergy Taster Day with Bishop Steven in the new year.

We encourage all our bishops to go on a Cursillo weekend, but if this is their only experience of Cursillo, then we need to re-emphasise that Cursillo is not about sending open-minded Christians off on a warm, fluffy retreat where they are bathed in God's love, but about our response in our "4th day" back in our own parishes – to "bloom where we are planted". That is why it was good to that so many of us were able to introduce ourselves as active Christians (and also Cursillistas) during his tour of deaneries. Cursillo is primarily about creating modern-day apostles, being sent back to our communities, empowered and enabled to share God's love with everyone.

Another way in which this was apparent was to be able to celebrate our three Cursillistas who were ordained in the summer: Ellen Turtle (our former Secretary, now in the Guildford Diocese), plus Wendy Middleton and Paula Smith in this diocese. We pray for them and for all Cursillistas in their various ministries and callings - we all have a part to play in changing the world for Christ.

Remember, Christ is counting on you... (I trust you know the appropriate response!)

The venue was incredible and we were treated to an inspiring and moving Action Talk by Ali on her prison ministry.

Day of Deeper Understanding (DDU)

This was held at the Soltau Centre, Henley Road, Stubbings SL6 6QW on Saturday, 22nd October 2016. It was a great event, with a mixture of new Cursillistas, old faithfuls and a few returnees who hadn't really been involved with Cursillo for a while. There were 6 talks on different aspects of the Cursillo movement including an instructional Ultreya. One of my aims was to reinvigorate the 4th Day activity of Oxford Anglican Cursillo and I know of at least one Cursillista who is back in Group Reunion after coming along.

Supporting New Cursillistas

One of the talks at the Day of Deeper Understanding was about the importance of the sponsor's role before, during and especially after the weekend. Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held at St. Helen's Church Centre, Abingdon on 12th November 2016

The meeting started at 11.25am.

1. Present:

2. **The minutes of the previous AGM** on 28th November 2016 were unanimously agreed after corrections to the list of those present.
3. There were no **matters arising** from the minutes.
4. **The annual report for the year ending 31st August 2016** had been sent to all members. The following additional comments were made.

4.1. Lay Director's report

Pauline Stanton-Saringer said that there had been a significant learning curve for her in her first year as Lay Director. She expressed her thanks to the support given by the Secretariat with special thanks to Caraline Hedges as a very active and encouraging 4th Day Representative and to those who had given their time and effort for the special events such as the weekends.

The Day of Deeper Understanding had proved to be good with increased understanding and fellowship for the 22 attending.

Pauline expressed thanks to those now stepping down from their roles: Ann Moss, booking secretary; Libby Hawkness-Smith, editor of OxonFourth; Sarah Smith, Palanca Representative.

4.2. Spiritual Director's Report

Kevin Beer admitted that starting a new incumbency at the same time as becoming the Spiritual Director had not been the best timing. He has conducted a survey of members but has not been able to do anything with it yet. Charles Miller, the previous Spiritual Director, confirmed that it is not any easy role with the most important, though difficult task of encouraging other clergy. To have the prayerful support of Cursillistas is very helpful.

4.3. Communications Representative

There have been problems with emails which are being addressed. Cursillistas are asked to share information at Group Reunions and to advise where other Cursillistas are not receiving emails.

5. Treasurer's Report.

The treasurer's report was circulated at the meeting.

The high cost of cancelling the booking at Cold Ash for the postponed Weekend was because we were late in making the cancellation; this delay was because there was hope that we would have a viable weekend. A generous donation covered the loss. There will now be just one weekend each year.

Planned giving is up but other donations are down. Gift Aid is yet to be claimed; it is expected to be £616.

The overall balance remains close to that at the last end of year.

Adoption of the accounts was proposed by Charles Miller, seconded by Ann Moss, and unanimously agreed

6. Independent Examiner

Mr P B Hicks was nominated as Independent examiner. He was proposed by Libby Hawkness-Smith and seconded by Kevin Beer. Mr Hicks was unanimously appointed.

7. Secretariat Elections

Secretary : there were no nominations received so the position remains open.

Palanca Representative : Ann Moss and Linda Hobbs offered to fulfil this role together. The meeting accepted their offer.

Booking Secretary : Jill Iredale was proposed by Pauline Stanton-Saringer and seconded by Ali Askew. She was elected unopposed.

OxonFourth editor : there were no nominations so the position remains open. The format of OxonFourth may change for it to become an online publication which will be sent to members by email and be put on the website.

Music Coordinator : there were no nominations so the position remains open.

Concern was expressed about the difficulty of finding volunteers for the roles which need to be filled. It was agreed that the situation should be left with Cursillistas' prayers.

8. AOB

Charles Miller advocated attendance at national Cursillo events. Several Cursillistas had attended them and found them very good. He particularly recommended the Cursillo leaders' workshops. Charles encouraged everyone to talk about them at our Group Reunions.

Charles was pleased to tell those present that the Abingdon clergy now use a modified form of the Group Reunion Card.

Peter Watsham gave a vote of thanks to Pauline Stanton-Saringer who, in turn, thanked Peter for his fellowship and encouragement.
